

BAHT LEVEL II COURSE



Splinting: A Clinical Reasoning Approach

24th to 26th June 2018 - Chelmsford, Essex.

This course is designed for Physiotherapists and Occupational Therapists with a BAHT Level I qualification or two years clinical experience in hand therapy, who wish to develop skills in clinical reasoning for and practical fabrication of a variety of splints for the hand, wrist and forearm.

The course itself will be very practically focussed, working with a variety of splinting materials and techniques. Delegates will be expected to complete some directed independent study prior to attendance, in order to fully understand the theoretical aspects of splinting practice before applying these to a range of clinical scenarios during the course. There will also be interactive participation elements to the course, using internet based software so you will need to bring with you a suitable device to make the most of this (e.g. smartphone, tablet or laptop). Free wifi is available throughout the course venue.

The course facilitators (Charlotte Flynn, Debbie Miles and Kathy Whalley) have many years of clinical experience in hand therapy and splinting, working in a variety of settings and also of teaching in higher education as well as other BAHT validated courses.

Location:

The city of Chelmsford is approximately 35 minutes from central London by train, or there are buses available to the city directly from both London Stansted and Southend airports. The course venue itself is outside the city centre with plenty of free parking available on site for those travelling by car or a minibus service will be arranged from/to Chelmsford city centre on each day of the course for the convenience of any delegates wishing to use this. If you are able to pay your own course fees initially and then claim these back from your employer then you are very welcome to use the self-funded fee rates. Course fees include all teaching (distance learning tutorials prior to course, and during course), course manual, lunch and refreshments each day of the course, all splinting equipment materials required during the course and marking of course exam and assignment.

Cancellation Policy:

- Greater than six months' notice: full refund of course fees, minus administration fee of £30.
- Between four and six months notice of cancellation: 50% refund of the course fee paid.
- Cancellations later than four months prior to the course are not eligible for any refund.
- Substitutions can be made at any time up to two weeks prior to the course.
- If, due to unforeseen circumstances the organisers have to cancel the course all fees paid will be returned in full but no responsibility is taken for any other costs incurred by delegates, such as non-refundable travel or accommodation.
